

Children Served

213 new children from Charlottesville and Albemarle County and
43 new children from surrounding counties.

The **256** children were:

67% Female
33% Male
2% American Indian
12% Bi-racial/Other
22% Black/African American
7% Hispanic/Latino
57% White
32% 0-6 years old
41% 7-12 years old
27% 13-17 years old
20% Reporting disabilities



The children were alleged victims of at least one type of abuse, some more than one:

40% Sexual abuse
22% Physical abuse
11% Neglect
8% Witness to violence
5% Emotional abuse
13% Other type of abuse

"My experience here was great. I am very grateful. I appreciate everything they did for me and my daughter."

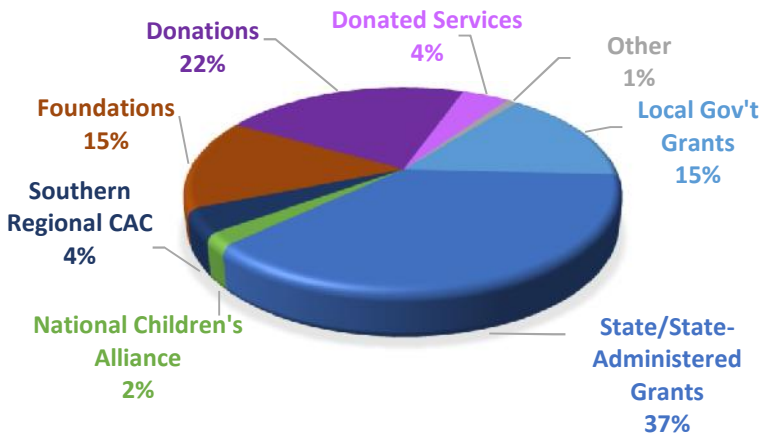
"Everyone was very understanding and listened to what I had to say...They made me feel like [helping my child] is a priority to them."

In FY 2016, 331 adults participated in our community trainings on child abuse prevention and intervention.

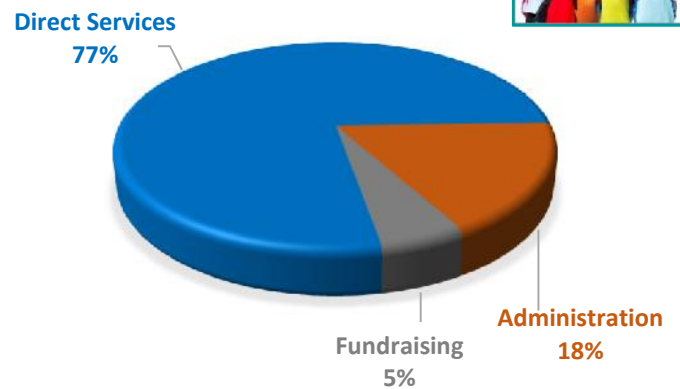
